## **ANNOUNCEMENTS**

CPSC Issues Consumer Warnings on Infant Pillows, E-Bike Batteries, Hammer Toys, and More

Throughout the month of April, the Consumer Product Safety Commission (CPSC) issued several public health and safety notices to consumers, warning the public to stop using products posing a range of hazards. These unilateral warnings are issued because the manufacturers have not agreed to a recall or offered a remedy to consumers:

- <u>Chibebe Snuggle Pods</u>: Suffocation Hazard; Violation of the Federal Ban on Infant Pillows.
- <u>Unit Pack Power (UPP) E-bike Batteries</u>: Fire and Burn Hazards; Risk of Serious Injury and Death.
- <u>Chiwanji Vertical Box Hammer Case Hammer Toys</u>: Choking Hazard; Banned Small Parts.
- <u>OmvedTherapies Baby Pillows</u>: Suffocation Hazard; Violation of the Federal Ban on Infant Pillows.
- <u>True Brothers Refillable Fuel Bottles</u>: Poisoning, Burn, and Flash Fire Hazards; Violation of the Children's Gasoline Burn Prevention Act.
- <u>Pink Vine Refillable Fuel Bottles</u>: Poisoning, Burn, and Flash Fire Hazards; Violation of the Children's Gasoline Burn Prevention Act.
- <u>Innovative Hearth Products (IHP) gas fireplaces</u>: Fire and Burn Hazards; Risk of Serious Injury and Death.

## **TOP RECALLS**

<u>April 25, 2024 CPSC</u>; JAKKS Pacific recalled its Mario Kart<sup>™</sup> 24V Ride-On Racer Cars because if the acceleration pedal on the battery-operated ride-on toy becomes clogged with debris, it can stick after the user's foot is removed from the pedal, posing a crash hazard. Units: About 17,500.

<u>April 25, 2024 CPSC</u>; Crate & Barrel recalled its Hampshire Cribs because the mattress support pins can become loose and allow the mattress to fall, posing a fall hazard to children. Units: About 3,200 (an additional 120 in Canada).

<u>April 25, 2024 CPSC</u>; 3M recalled its 3M<sup>™</sup> Peltor<sup>™</sup> X4 Series Earmuffs because the noise-reducing earmuffs can develop cracks in the colored portion of the plastic cups, posing a risk of overexposure to loud noise and sound. Units: About 40,000 (an additional ~6,700 in Canada).

<u>April 11, 2024 CPSC</u>; Johnson Health Tech North America expands its recall of Matrix T1 and T3 Series Commercial Treadmills because the power cord can become loose from the treadmill's power socket, posing a fire hazard. Units: About 9,700 (an additional ~19,900 recalled in January 2022).

<u>April 11, 2024 CPSC</u>; Delta Cycle recalled its Delta Cycle and Dimension Stem Raisers because the stem raiser can shift during use, causing the bicycle's handlebar to shift unexpectantly, posing a fall hazard. Units: About 500,000 (an additional ~8,520 in Canada).

<u>April 11, 2024 CPSC</u>; Red Land Cotton recalled its "Quilts" and "Quilted Shams" because pieces of broken needles were found inside some quilts and quilted shams, posing a laceration hazard. Units: About 17,400.

<u>April 11, 2024 CPSC</u>; Yoto recalled its Mini speakers because the speaker's lithiumion battery can overheat and catch fire, posing burn and fire hazards to consumers. Units: About 251,165 (an additional ~18,932 in Canada).

<u>April 4, 2024 CPSC</u>; Procter & Gamble recalled its Tide Pods, Gain Flings, Ace Pods and Ariel Pods liquid laundry detergent packets packaged in flexible film bags because the outer packaging meant to prevent access to the contents can split open near the zipper track, posing a risk of serious injury to children and other vulnerable populations if the contents of the laundry detergent packets are ingested, as well as posing a risk of skin or eye injuries. Units: About 8.2 million (an additional ~56,741 in Canada).

<u>April 4, 2024 CPSC</u>; Empower Brands recalled its BLACK+DECKER Model HGS011 Easy Garment Steamers because they can expel, spray, or leak hot water during use, posing a burn hazard to consumers. Units: About 1.6 million (an additional ~518,500 were recalled in November 2022).

<u>April 4, 2024 CPSC</u>; Walmart recalled its Mainstays Electric Mini Choppers because the chopper's blade can operate unexpectedly during assembly or when not enclosed in the container, posing a laceration hazard to consumers. Units: About 51,750.

<u>April 4, 2024 CPSC</u>; Lovey & Grink recalled its Children's Two-Piece Pajamas and Lounge Dresses because they violate the flammability regulations for children's sleepwear, posing a risk of burn injuries to children. Units: About 23,720.

<u>April 4, 2024 CPSC</u>; Thule recalled its RideAlong rear-mounted Child Bike Seats because the harness padding of the bike seats can contain flame-retardant DecaBDE in excess of regulatory limits, posing a chemical hazard. DecaBDE can be toxic if it is ingested or comes into contact with skin or eyes. Units: About 8,640 (an additional ~3,880 in Canada).

# RECALLS

<u>April 25, 2024 CPSC</u>; The Multi-Purpose Kids' Bike Helmets sold exclusively on Temu.com, have been recalled because the helmets do not comply with the dynamic strength of retention system, impact attenuation and certification requirements of the CPSC federal safety regulation for bicycle helmets. The helmets can fail to protect in the event of a crash, posing a risk of head injury. Units: About 200.

<u>April 25, 2024 CPSC</u>; JAKKS Pacific recalled its Mario Kart™ 24V Ride-On Racer Cars because if the acceleration pedal on the battery-operated ride-on toy becomes

clogged with debris, it can stick after the user's foot is removed from the pedal, posing a crash hazard. Units: About 17,500.

<u>April 25, 2024 CPSC</u>; Crate & Barrel recalled its Hampshire Cribs because the mattress support pins can become loose and allow the mattress to fall, posing a fall hazard to children. Units: About 3,200 (an additional 120 in Canada).

<u>April 25, 2024 CPSC</u>; Sant and Abel recalled its Children's Two-Piece Pajama Sets because they fail to meet the flammability standards for children's sleepwear, posing a burn hazard to children. Units: About 935.

<u>April 25, 2024 CPSC</u>; 3M recalled its 3M<sup>™</sup> Peltor<sup>™</sup> X4 Series Earmuffs because the noise-reducing earmuffs can develop cracks in the colored portion of the plastic cups, posing a risk of overexposure to loud noise and sound. Units: About 40,000 (an additional ~6,700 in Canada).

<u>April 18, 2024 CPSC</u>; Randder Liquid Fuel Bottles, sold exclusively on Amazon.com by Render Store, have been recalled because the portable fuel containers do not meet the child-resistant requirements for closures under the Children's Gasoline Burn Prevention Act (CGBPA). The closure for the products is not child resistant, posing a risk of burns and poisoning to children. Units: About 1,830.

<u>April 18, 2024 CPSC</u>; Gasaciods recalled its Children's Multi-Purpose Helmets because the helmets do not comply with the positional stability, dynamic strength of retention system, impact attenuation, and certification requirements in violation of the CPSC federal safety regulation for bicycle helmets. The helmets can fail to protect in the event of a crash, posing a risk of head injury. Units: About 18.

<u>April 11, 2024 CPSC</u>; Johnson Health Tech North America expands its recall of Matrix T1 and T3 Series Commercial Treadmills because the power cord can become loose from the treadmill's power socket, posing a fire hazard. Units: About 9,700 (an additional ~19,900 recalled in January 2022).

<u>April 11, 2024 CPSC</u>; The Jugader Zipline Kits, sold exclusively on Amazon.com, have been recalled because the zipline's stainless-steel cable can break, posing a fall hazard. Units: About 6,600.

<u>April 11, 2024 CPSC</u>; Innovative Bedding Solutions and SBL recall their GhostBedbranded Natural Mattresses because the mattresses violate the smoldering ignition requirements of the federal mattress flammability regulation, posing a fire hazard. Units: About 1,250.

<u>April 11, 2024 CPSC</u>; Delta Cycle recalled its Delta Cycle and Dimension Stem Raisers because the stem raiser can shift during use, causing the bicycle's handlebar to shift unexpectantly, posing a fall hazard. Units: About 500,000 (an additional ~8,520 in Canada).

<u>April 11, 2024 CPSC</u>; Red Land Cotton recalled its "Quilts" and "Quilted Shams" because pieces of broken needles were found inside some quilts and quilted shams, posing a laceration hazard. Units: About 17,400.

<u>April 11, 2024 CPSC</u>; The Touchat Large Fuzzy Area Rugs, sold exclusively on Amazon.com, because the recalled area rugs violate the mandatory federal flammability regulations for carpets and rugs, posing a fire hazard. Units: About 356.

<u>April 11, 2024 CPSC</u>; The BRS Liquid Fuel Bottles, sold exclusively on Amazon by Huenco, because the portable fuel bottles do not meet the child-resistant requirements for closures under the Children's Gasoline Burn Prevention Act (CGBPA). The closure for the products is not child-resistant, posing a risk of burn and poisoning to children. Units: About 1,600.

<u>April 11, 2024 CPSC</u>; Fischer Sports recalled its Fischer RC4 Junior Ski Boots because the ski boot cuff can rotate, causing the lock mechanism to malfunction, posing a fall hazard and risk of injury to the consumer. Units: About 1,460 (an additional ~114 in Canada).

<u>April 11, 2024 CPSC</u>; Yoto recalled its Mini speakers because the speaker's lithiumion battery can overheat and catch fire, posing burn and fire hazards to consumers. Units: About 251,165 (an additional ~18,932 in Canada).

<u>April 4, 2024 CPSC</u>; Procter & Gamble recalled its Tide Pods, Gain Flings, Ace Pods and Ariel Pods liquid laundry detergent packets packaged in flexible film bags because the outer packaging meant to prevent access to the contents can split open near the zipper track, posing a risk of serious injury to children and other vulnerable populations if the contents of the laundry detergent packets are ingested, as well as posing a risk of skin or eye injuries. Units: About 8.2 million (an additional ~56,741 in Canada).

<u>April 4, 2024 CPSC</u>; Zazaba International recalled its Grão de Gente Crib Bumper Bedding Sets because infants can suffocate if they roll or move on the crib bumper in a position that obstructs breathing. Padded crib bumpers are banned under the Safe Sleep for Babies Act of 2021. Units: About 795.

<u>April 4, 2024 CPSC</u>; Empower Brands recalled its BLACK+DECKER Model HGS011 Easy Garment Steamers because they can expel, spray, or leak hot water during use, posing a burn hazard to consumers. Units: About 1.6 million (an additional ~518,500 were recalled in November 2022).

<u>April 4, 2024 CPSC</u>; Walmart recalled its Mainstays Electric Mini Choppers because the chopper's blade can operate unexpectedly during assembly or when not enclosed in the container, posing a laceration hazard to consumers. Units: About 51,750.

<u>April 4, 2024 CPSC</u>; Lovey & Grink recalled its Children's Two-Piece Pajamas and Lounge Dresses because they violate the flammability regulations for children's sleepwear, posing a risk of burn injuries to children. Units: About 23,720.

<u>April 4, 2024 CPSC</u>; Thule recalled its RideAlong rear-mounted Child Bike Seats because the harness padding of the bike seats can contain flame-retardant DecaBDE in excess of regulatory limits, posing a chemical hazard. DecaBDE can be

toxic if it is ingested or comes into contact with skin or eyes. Units: About 8,640 (an additional ~3,880 in Canada).

This service collects recalls from the <u>National Highway Traffic Safety</u> <u>Administration</u>, <u>Consumer Product Safety Commission</u>, <u>Food and Drug</u> <u>Administration</u> and <u>Food Safety and Inspection Service</u>. Parents Central at <u>NHTSA's</u> <u>safercar.gov</u> is a go-to resource on car seats.

- Be careful about using hand-me-downs or buying children's products at a secondhand shop or yard sale.
